From the Principal's Desk

Happy Friday and welcome back to our first edition of THE LINK for 2024.

As you will read in the class updates, all classes have started the year in the most positive way, and it has been really pleasing to see the whole school settle into the year so smoothly.

A special welcome to our new Prep students and their families, as well as any other new Bayswater North families - we are super happy to have you!

I would also like to welcome some new and returning teachers to the school. Miss Aloizos is our new teacher in 1/2A, Mrs Sharkey is in 5/6A and Mr Hannah has returned to teach PE from Wednesday to Friday.

For the first two weeks of term there has been a 'Start Up' program running in all classes. The purpose of this is for students to build or strengthen relationships with their peers and teachers, learn new routines and feel really comfortable in their classes.

All students have participated in a revision of some Friendology practices and created class agreements for behaviour. They have also begun to unpack our new values of Connection, Respect and Perseverance, and explore what these mean and how they can demonstrate them each day.

I had a lovely visit from some of the Prep students while doing their tour of the school. They thought it was pretty special to be behind the Principal's desk, but I think they all preferred being in Prep rather than helping with my work.

From the Principal's Desk continued.....

There are lots of exciting things happening this year at Bayswater North, including plans for more whole school events with students - keep an eye out for further information to come out in the near future. I will also send out an updated events calendar once we have confirmed a few more dates.

Please keep an eye out on Compass for some start of year information and reminders that are relevant to all families.

A couple of things in particular to note are supervision times and gate closures.

Supervision Times

Please note that student supervision does not begin until 8:45 am each morning. We do have a very high number of students who arrive at school before this time each day, which is unfortunately becoming a problem.

I understand that family life is hectic in the mornings, and that people need to drop off other siblings at high school or get to work. However we need to ask parents to find another solution than dropping students at school early. This morning there were more than 50 students at school without supervision before 8:35 am. Teaching staff are not required to be at school by that time, and those that choose to come to school early are working on preparing resources for their classes.

Other options parents could consider could be to arrange to drop your child off at a friend's house to come to school with them, or to use our OshClub before and after school program. OshClub opens from 7am each morning.

We would really appreciate your help in this matter, so that we can keep all students happy and safe at school.

Gate Closures

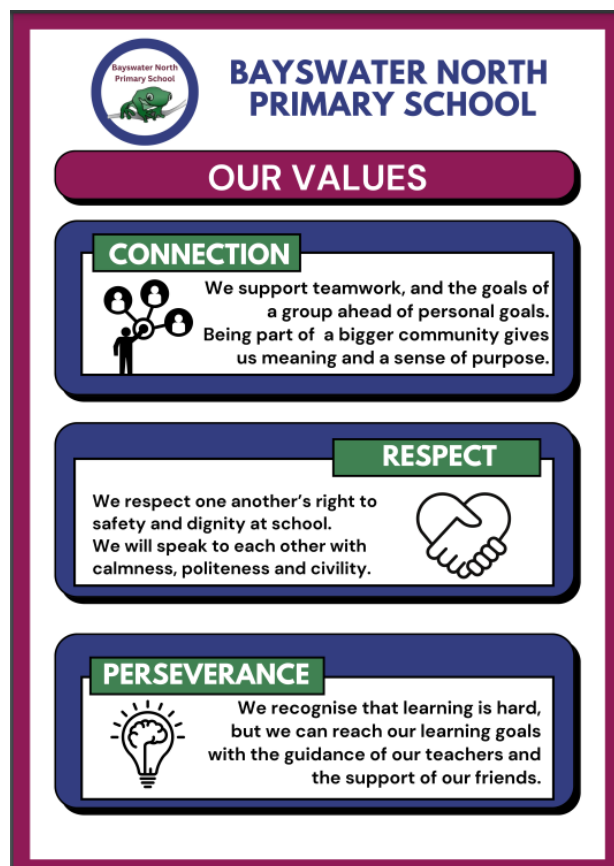
Some parents may have noticed that our boundary gates have been locked or closed during the day. This is to help us meet our duty of care and obligations under Child Safe laws. The school is currently working with the Department of Education to extend our boundary fences around the senior oval and staff car park. This will allow us to have one main access point at the front of the school. There are some temporary signs going up around the school today while we wait for more permanent signage to be installed.

This does include a sign that reminds people that the senior oval is actually school property (this includes the path ways on both ends of the oval) and that people are requested to stay off those areas during school hours. Like the supervision times, this will ensure we are meeting our obligations under Child Safe laws.

Students have settled in well and are getting used to the timetables.

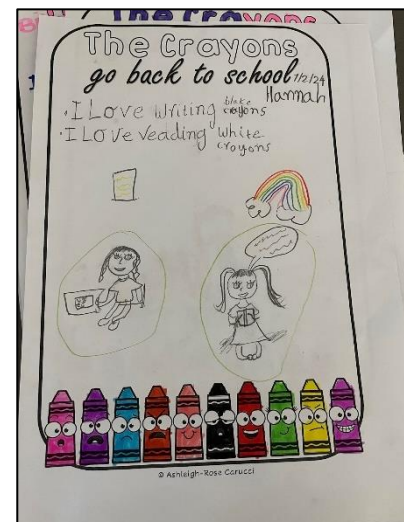
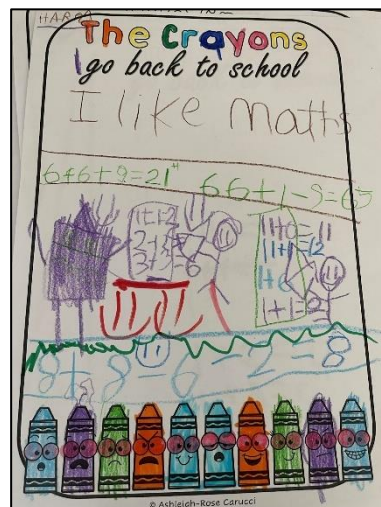
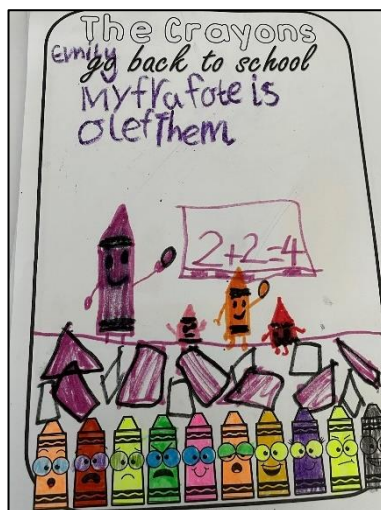

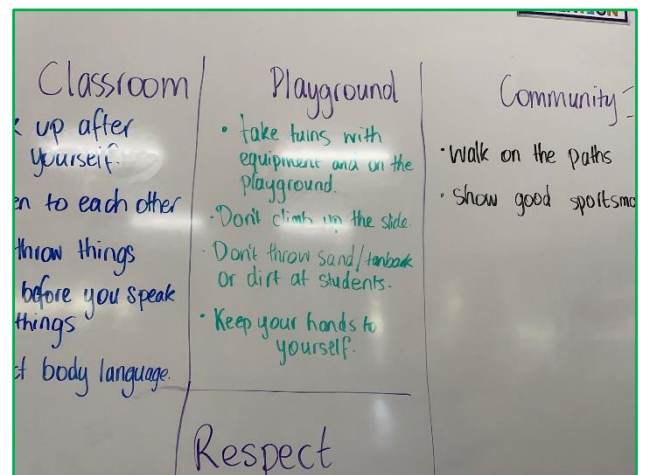

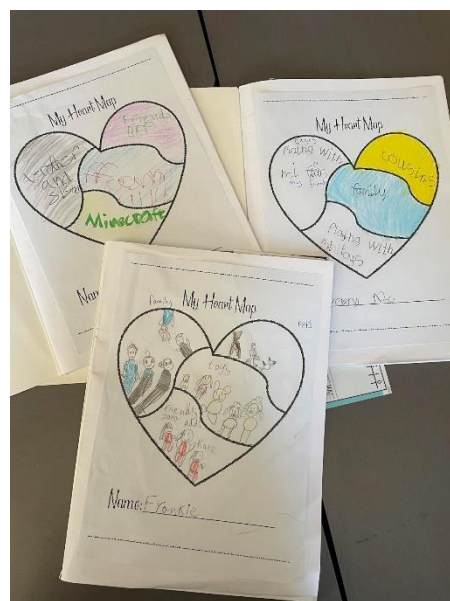
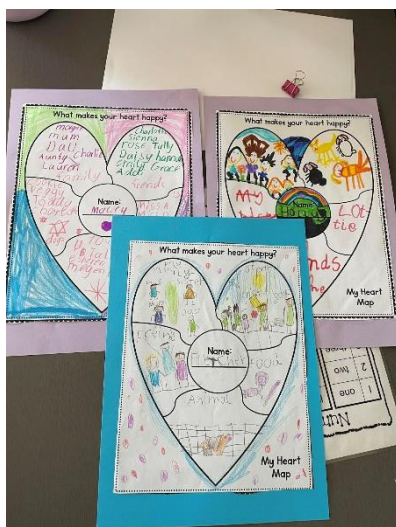
Mr Chicken All Over Australia

5/6 News

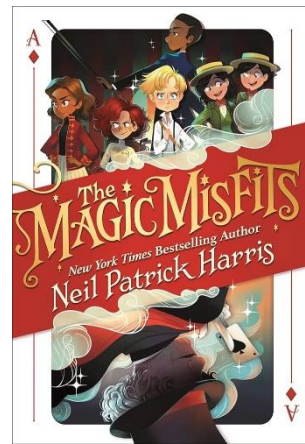

Visual Arts News

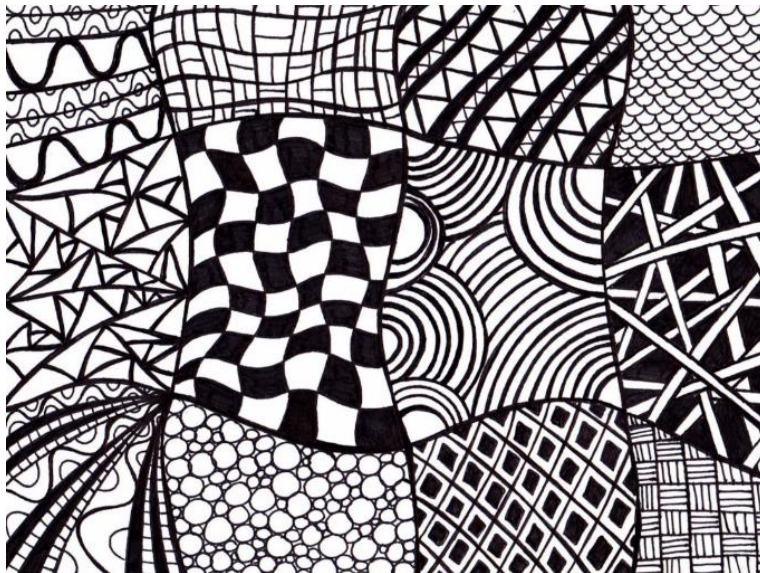
We have had a great start to the year in Visual Arts. The students have been really settled in their new classes and they have been keen to get straight into art making. Students began to work on their Visual Art Diary covers, which is where they put all of their ideas, sketches, notes and practises in. It's an important part of their learning in Art and it is always lovely to see where they begin and end up.

The 3-6's have been looking at perspective and creating form with letters as well as drawing zentangles. Zentangles are an easy-to-learn, relaxing, fun way to create beautiful images by drawing structured patterns, called tangles. Tangles can be made using a combination of dots, lines, simple curves and shapes. The repetition of creating the patterns and adding detail can create a feeling of 'zen'. It is a very mindful practise so is very good for your wellbeing and anyone can do it, so give it a try sometime.

Here is an example...

Grade 1/2's have also had a play with simple zentangles and have practised drawing a self-portrait, with crazy zentangle hair, as well as looked at the rainbow colour spectrum using the acronym ROYGBIV to create their covers. Foundation students are getting used to the art room and processes and have been doing some drawing and get to know you activities.

Week 3 will be my last week for a little bit as I take some long service leave and I try my hand at building furniture and cabinetry at TAFE. I will return for the last two weeks of Term 2 and immediately be preparing for our 2024 Art show that will happen at the end of Term 3. Very exiting!



In the meantime, the students will be in the very capable hands of Caroline Bowen, who is very excited about teaching Art. She will be visiting on Monday to get to know some of classes and work with me on what will be happening this semester in Visual Arts. You can get to know her as well as the other new teachers to BNPS in this LINK.

Please remember to bring named Art smocks if you have not done so already, as students will be using them in the coming weeks.

Thank you to those who already brought theirs.

How was your Christmas holiday break? Mine was relaxing – sleeping, walking, reading.

Welcome to new students and families. I trust that your time at BNPS is fabulous.

This is my 4th year as Chaplain here, and I love working with people of all ages.

A Chaplain's role is to care for our school community, providing support in whatever ways are necessary, as noted below.

If you would like your child to speak with me: There are many students at BNPS with whom I interact. We talk about family conflict, separation, death and loss, anxiety, the world, faith, peers, whatever we need. If you would like your child to speak with me, there is a Consent Form that I can provide. You can complete this form and forward it via email or your child. It would be helpful if you can make contact through Compass or my email below, to advise the background of the issue.

I aim to support the whole school community in various ways. Here are some of the aspects of how this care is provided:

EMOTIONAL: Many students come to talk about their emotions, their feelings, and we talk about strategies, and what we can or cannot control and we play games.

SOCIAL: School can be a challenging place, with many different personalities. Students often need to talk this through, sometimes with their friends in a restorative situation and of course, games

SPIRITUAL: I am happy to discuss faith or world issues at any time, and pray for anyone. This is always an option that is available as part of my pastoral care and games.

PRACTICAL: Every Thursday before school we have our Breakfast Club program, plus second-hand uniform items are available for a gold coin donation. The uniforms are available in the Hall foyer. There is a container for \$ when you purchase items.

I love lots of different artists and kinds of music, but some old favourites include Nirvana, Faith No More and Madonna

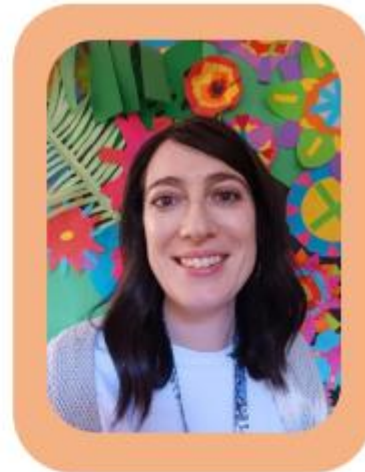

Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund 2024

Camps, Sports and Excursions fund eligibility

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 – Eligibility

To be eligible* for the fund, a mature minor of sixteen years of age or over, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- on the first day of Term one, or;
 - on the first day of Term two.
- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR
 - b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
 - c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.

* A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: [Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund \(CSEF\): Eligibility | education.vic.gov.au](https://education.vic.gov.au)

Mature minors or parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and seventeen years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and eighteen years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooling, or TAFE.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders, CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on **29 January 2024 and/or 15 April 2024**.

Payment amounts

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$150.00 per year.
- Secondary school student rate: \$250.00 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly to the school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: [Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund \(CSEF\): Payment amounts | education.vic.gov.au](https://education.vic.gov.au)

Foundation and Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents, so please register your interest at the school.

How to complete the application form – Forms are available at the office

NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

1. Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.
Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
3. Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2024 closes at the end of term two 2024.
4. If you have previously applied for CSEF it will automatically be processed if still eligible.


