Student Voice - Junior School Council

Our Junior School Council have begun their role this year by seeking requests from their classes about some things they would like to make the school even better. They invited me to a meeting and discussed their ideas, and also presented some information at Assembly last week. The requests include things like new sports equipment to use at play times, pumps for balls, repainting the 'rebound wall' near the senior oval, repainting four square courts and some new basketball and netball nets.

I was able to share that the netball and basketball nets will be taken care of as part of our playground upgrade.

As we can now securely lock the school after hours, we have installed new soccer nets on the junior oval and painted the existing football posts and set up the post pads on the senior oval.

I handed out some new soccer balls to classes today, and am organising some of the other items from their list.

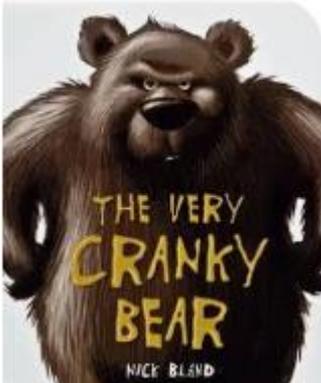
Junior School News

Harmony Day

On Monday, the students were encouraged to wear a touch of orange or their national dress to show support for cultural diversity, inclusiveness, and mutual respect, with the core message that "everyone belongs". Literacy

The Preps have now met twelve letters of the alphabet so far as part of Little Learners Love Literacy. Those letters are M, S, F, A, P, T, C, I, B, H, N, O. They are practising how to correctly form those letters as well as spell three letter words. The Grade 1 / 2 students are learning about narratives. We've started this week with reading the book 'The Very Cranky Bear' by Nick Bland, looking at the characters, setting, problems and solutions in the story.



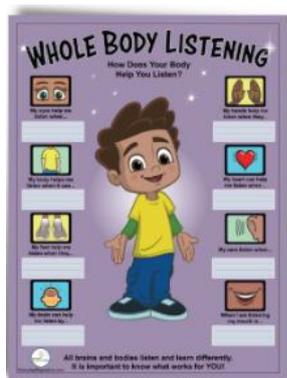
Maths

The Preps have been continuing to practise counting using the bead frame and subitising collections to 10. The past week, Grade 1 / 2 students have been creating pattern sequences with numbers, shapes and Australia coins. They have been playing games such as 'Get Out of My House' to help develop number fluency and strategic thinking.



Wellbeing

The junior school have been focussing on how we listen to learn, by using the strategies from 'Listening Larry'. We have discussed what active listening looks like and what happens when we don't listen carefully to others.



Buddies

The Preps have met their buddies. The announcement was made in the library and then the Year Sixers shared a book that they had made about themselves with their Prep buddy as well as reading some picture story books to the Preps. A lovely time was had by all.



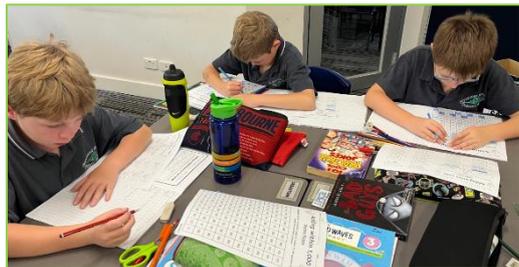
IN GRADE 3/4



Maths

In Maths, students have been developing their understanding of addition using a range of strategies. They have been working with both concrete materials and written methods to solve problems, including using number lines, partitioning numbers, and the vertical algorithm. Students have also been building their confidence when solving up to 6 digit addition problems, with a focus on explaining their thinking and showing their working.

It has been wonderful to see students challenge themselves, use different strategies, and support one another during collaborative learning tasks.



NAPLAN

Our students approached NAPLAN with a positive attitude and demonstrated great resilience throughout the assessment period. Everyone did their very best and applied the skills they have been developing in the classroom.

We are so proud of the way students stayed focused and persevered through each task.



HARMONY DAY

We had a fantastic time celebrating Harmony Day, recognising and embracing the cultural diversity within our school community. Students participated in a range of activities that promoted inclusion, respect, and a sense of belonging for everyone.

It was wonderful to see students learning about different cultures and celebrating what makes each of us unique. A highlight of the day was the concert, where students performed a song from another culture, proudly showcasing their learning and appreciation for diversity.

The day was a great reminder that “Everyone Belongs,” and our students demonstrated this through their kindness and respect towards one another.

GRADE 5/6 Classroom News

Do you know how many lines of symmetry a regular hexagon has? Our senior students do!

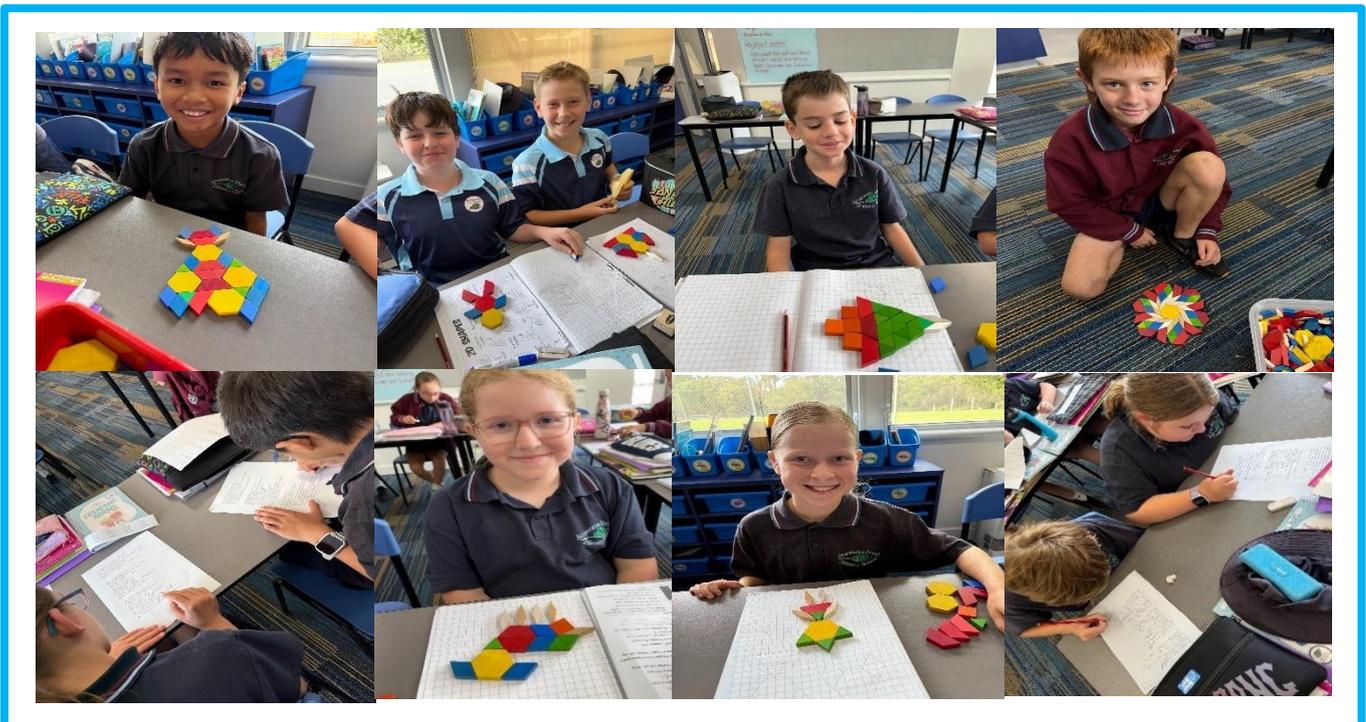
This week in our classroom, students have been busy investigating 2D and 3D shapes, focusing on their attributes such as sides, vertices, edges and faces. Students have also been learning to identify regular and irregular polygons, as well as exploring quadrilaterals and different types of triangles. They have been building their understanding by comparing shapes, making composite shapes and explaining their reasoning using mathematical language. Next week, we will be extending this learning by exploring nets and creating our own 3D shapes.

In reading, students have been developing their comprehension skills by learning about different types of questions. We have focused on literal, inferential and evaluative questions to help deepen understanding of texts. Our mentor text has been *The Soldier's Gift* by Tony Palmer and Jane Tanner, a picture storybook set during World War I. It is about connection, kindness and remembrance. The story explores how small actions can have a meaningful impact. The beautiful illustrations add emotion and depth to the text, supporting readers to understand the setting and themes. It was a perfect book to support rich discussions, inferential thinking and thoughtful responses.

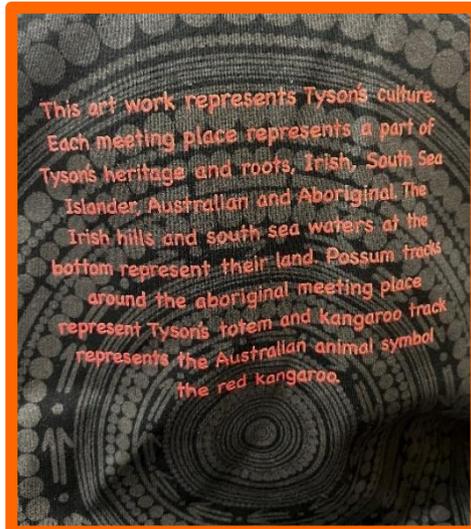
We are continuing to work on creating engaging narratives. The focus is on planning, and how to build tension through rising action leading to a strong climax. Using a "Midnight Journey" picture stimulus, students have been encouraged to use their imagination to develop descriptive and creative stories.

In integrated studies, students have been learning about Civics and Citizenship, with a focus on Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander organisations. They have explored the important services these organisations provide, including health services, education support, cultural preservation, legal services and land and environmental care. Students have been discussing why these services are important and how they contribute to supporting communities and broader civic goals.

It has been wonderful to see students engaging with their learning, building confidence and sharing their thinking with others.

Physical Education

Now that the students have met me in PE class, I'd love to introduce myself to the greater Bayswater North Primary School community. My name is Aaron Tait and I've just taken on the PE teacher position for the rest of this year. It's great to be here!

While I'm really looking forward to the kids and I getting to know each other more, I can share a few facts about me to start the process: I've been a primary school teacher for 16 years at five schools, and this is definitely the closest to home. Outside of school, I have been involved in basketball in some way for 35 years - my current role is as a live commentator for the Kilsyth Cobras' NBL1 teams. And I don't want to get ahead of myself, but I'm hoping this is the Bulldogs' year in the AFL and that the Phoenix bring home their first NBL chip!

Under the wise guidance of Mrs Smith for the first six weeks, the students came into my first lessons with a strong grasp on what I was teaching. The kids have adjusted amazingly to their new teacher and we're all very excited for what lies ahead in the subject. Thanks for having me, Baysie North!

Our **Foundation** students are in the middle of a unit on **team games**, where they are learning how their contributions can help a group of people. We gave tunnelball a try last week, then moved onto a series of relays this week.

In **Years 1 & 2**, we are nearing the end of our focus on **throwing and catching**. We have looked at the correct catching techniques for catching a ball both above and below our waist, then moved into the technique of throwing overarm for throws that need to go a long way.

Our **Years 3-6** students finished a unit on **netball** last week by playing in a game simulation. The students showed a terrific understanding of the rules and the concepts of the game, as well as where they were and weren't allowed to be. I was especially impressed by those who play netball outside of school, who showed great leadership and helped explain some of the finer details of the game to their classmates.

Lastly, keep an eye out for some details about our Cross Country event, which will be happening in the early stages of Term 2.

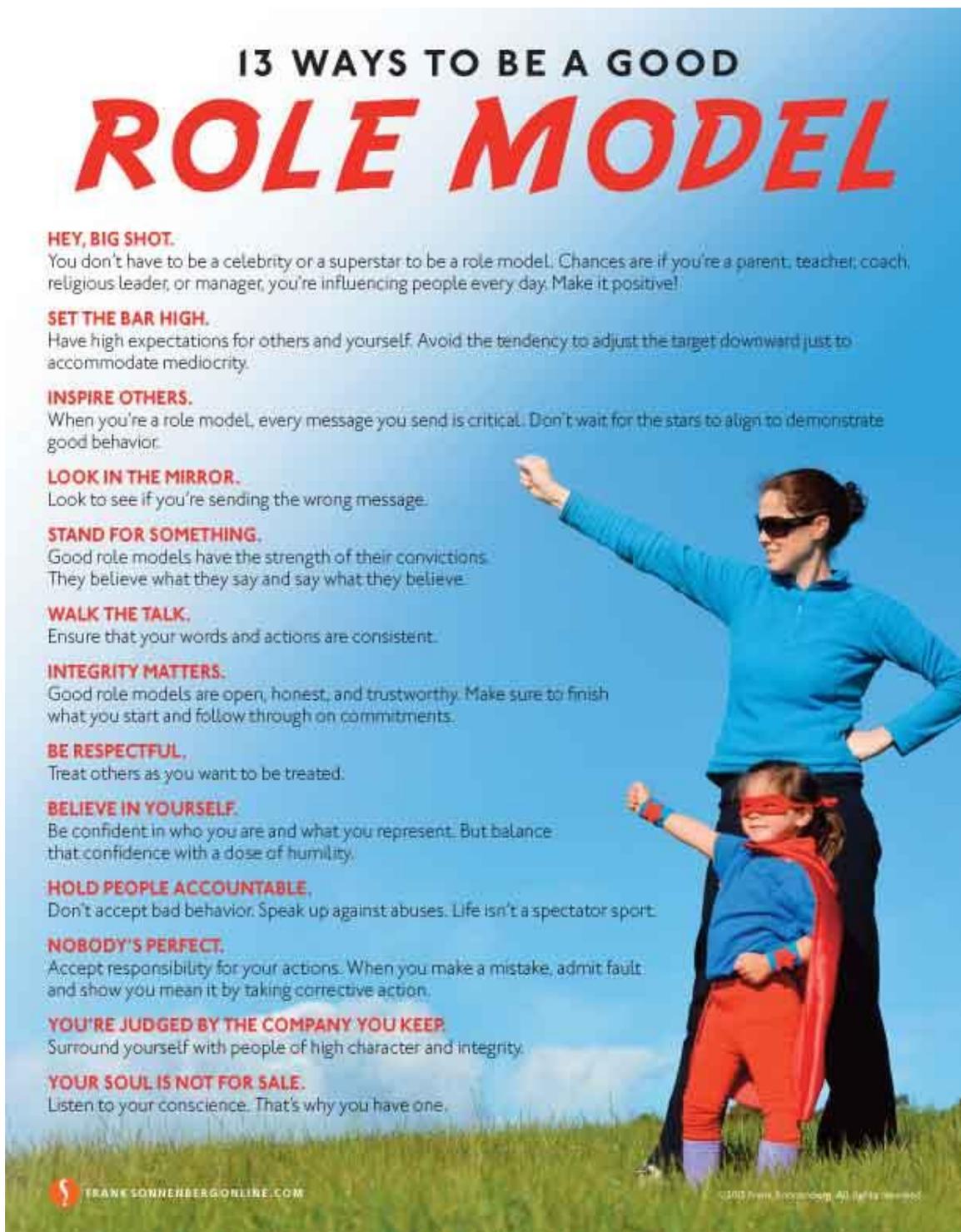
Community Leaders
